H.E. Amb. Senén Florensa, Executive President, IEMed

H.E. Amb. Senén Florensa is the Executive President of the European Institute of the Mediterranean (IEMed), where he also serves as Chair of the EuroMeSCo General Assembly and Director of the quarterly *afkar/ideas* and the *IEMed Mediterranean Yearbook*.

A career diplomat with the personal rank of Ambassador, he previously served in various high-level diplomatic and academic positions. Ambassador Florensa holds degrees in Economic Science and Law from the University of Barcelona and completed his PhD in Economics at the Universidad Complutense de Madrid, after doctoral studies at Université Paris I Panthéon-Sorbonne and New York University as a Fulbright scholar.

His distinguished career reflects a lifelong dedication to Euro-Mediterranean dialogue, development cooperation, and cultural exchange.



Prof. Heba Handoussa, Acting President, FEMISE

Prof. Heba Handoussa is Interim Managing Director of the Economic Research Forum (ERF) and Representative of the ERF Presidency in FEMISE. A distinguished economist and founder of Egypt Network for Integrated Development (ENID, 2012) and the Egypt Foundation for Integrated Development (El Nidaa, 2016), she has pioneered inclusive models for women's and youth empowerment in Upper Egypt.

Formerly Professor and Vice Provost at the American University in Cairo, she authored award-winning Egypt Human Development Reports and, as ERF's founding Managing Director, established the region's leading hub for policy-relevant research. She has advised the Egyptian government and served on national and international boards including the Central Bank of Egypt, the World Bank Chief Economist's Council of Eminent Persons, and UNRISD.

H.E. Mr. Jaume Duch, Minister for EU & Foreign Action, Gov. of Catalonia

H.E. Mr. Jaume Duch Guillot is the Minister for European Union and Foreign Action of the Government of Catalonia. A prominent Spanish politician and communicator, he has dedicated his career to advancing European integration and institutional communication.

Prior to this role, he served as Director-General for Communication and Spokesperson of the European Parliament (2017–2024), where he led the institution's global communication strategy and media relations. He began his career in 1990 as an EU official and has since held several key roles within European institutions.

Mr. Duch holds a Law degree from the University of Barcelona and has served as Associate Professor of Public International Law. His work has been recognized with several awards in communication and public service. He is a member of the Advisory Board of the Jean Monnet Foundation for Europe.



H.E. Amb. Nasser Kamel, Secretary General, Union for the Mediterranean (UFM)

H.E. Amb. Nasser Kamel is the Secretary General of the Union for the Mediterranean (UfM) and a seasoned Egyptian diplomat with a distinguished career in international relations.

He previously served as Ambassador of Egypt to the United Kingdom (2014–2018) and Ambassador to France (2006–2012), where he contributed to the launch of the Union for the Mediterranean through the 2008 Paris Summit Joint Declaration. He also held senior positions as Assistant Minister for Arab and Middle Eastern Affairs (2012–2014) and Director of Egypt's Public Information Service (2004–2006).

Ambassador Kamel studied Political Science at Brussels University and Cairo University, and graduated from the Diplomatic Institute of the Ministry of Foreign Affairs in Cairo and the École Nationale d'Administration (ENA) in Paris. He has been honored as *Grand Officier de l'Ordre National du Mérite* by the Republic of France and received decorations from Belgium and Portugal.

Mr. Stefano Sannino is an Italian diplomat and senior EU official with an extensive career in European and international affairs. Since February 2025, he has served as Director-General for the Middle East, North Africa and the Gulf (DG MENA) at the European Commission.

Prior to this, he was Secretary-General of the European External Action Service (EEAS) from 2021 to 2024 and Ambassador of Italy to Spain and Andorra from 2016 to 2020. He also served as Permanent Representative of Italy to the EU, Director-General for Enlargement, and held several senior positions within the European Commission and the Italian diplomatic service.



Prof. Patrick Plane, Emeritus Research Director in Economics, CERDI-CNR

Prof. Patrick Plane is Emeritus Research Director in Economics at the Centre for Studies and Research on International Development (CERDI), part of the French National Center for Scientific Research (CNRS) and He is also associate professor of the University Clermont Auvergne where he teaches different courses in relation with development economics.

He holds a PhD in Economics from the University of Auvergne and has served as Head of CERDI (2001–2013) and Member of the United Nations Committee for Development Policy (2010–2016).

Dr. Plane is a member of the European Development Research Network (EUDN), Co-Editor of the Revue d'Économie du Développement, and a resource person for the African Economic Research Consortium. His focuses industrial research on economics, competitiveness, public-private partnerships, development policy, primarily in Sub-Saharan Africa and the MENA region. He has published extensively in highimpact academic journals including World Development, Journal of Development Studies, and Economic Modelling.



Dr. Raed Safadi, Partner & Chief Economist, Whiteshield

Dr. Raed Safadi is Partner and Chief Economist at Whiteshield Partners, a global advisory firm based in Dubai specializing in public policy, economic strategy, and artificial intelligence.

With over three decades of experience in economic development, trade policy, and international cooperation, he previously served as Chief Economist at Dubai's Department of Economy and Tourism, where he led initiatives for post-COVID-19 recovery, economic diversification, and innovation-led growth.

Before that, Dr. Safadi held senior positions at the OECD and the World Bank, advising governments and international organizations on fiscal reform, trade, and sustainable growth.

He holds a PhD in Economics from Georgetown University and has published extensively on development, trade, and globalization, including the book *Inclusive Global Value Chains*.



Prof. Samir Makdisi is Professor Emeritus of Economics and Founding Director of the Institute of Financial Economics, at the American University of Beirut (AUB). He is a former Minister of Economy, Republic of Lebanon (1992), Deputy President of AUB (1992–1998) and Chair of the Board of Trustees, Economic Research Forum (1993–2001) and, an elected member of the Board, 2012–2022.

Recipient of several honors including the AUB medal (1998), he is widely published in academic journals and has written books in the areas of financial policies, civil conflict and democratic transitions, among others, with special reference to the Arab World. He is co-editor (with Ibrahim Elbadawi) of Democratic Transitions in the Arab World published by Cambridge University Press (2017). He received his PhD in Economics from Columbia University, New York.



Dr. Roger Albinyana, Managing Director, IEMed

Dr. Roger Albinyana is the Managing Director of the European Institute of the Mediterranean (IEMed), where he has worked since 2016, previously serving as Director of Euro-Mediterranean Policies. He is also Associate Professor at the University of Barcelona, teaching international economic policy, and serves on several advisory bodies, including the Euro-Mediterranean Economists Association (EMEA) and the Partnership for Research and Innovation in the Mediterranean Area (PRIMA).

Before joining IEMed, Dr. Albinyana held senior public service roles, including Secretary General for Foreign and EU Affairs of the Government of Catalonia and Advisor on Private Sector Development at the Union for the Mediterranean. He holds a PhD and MA in Economic History from the University of Barcelona, a BA in Economics from Pompeu Fabra University, and a BA in Business Administration and Management from the Open University of Catalonia.




Prof. Michael Gasiorek, Professor of Economics University of Sussex, UK

Prof. Michael Gasiorek is Professor of Economics at the University of Sussex and Director of the Centre for Inclusive Trade Policy (CITP), funded by the UK Economic and Social Research Council (ESRC). He also serves as Co-Director of the UK Trade Policy Observatory.

His research specializes in international trade and regional integration, with a focus on supply chains, trade and development, and the policy implications of trade dynamics. Prof. Gasiorek has led numerous policy projects for the European Commission, the World Bank, and the UK Government, and previously managed InterAnalysis, a University spin-out company delivering trade policy training across Asia.

He has published extensively in leading journals such as World Economy, Economic Policy, European Economic Review, and Applied Economics, and continues to advise governments and institutions on trade policy and global economic integration.



Dr. Insaf Guedidi, Université de Tunis, (ESSECT), Tunisia




Dr. Anna Ferragina, Associate Professor, Department of Economics & Statistics, University of Salerno, Italy
